THE LAW, THE CROSS, AND GRACE MATTHEW 5:17-20 4-21-24

KEY THOUGHT: The Law points to the grace of the cross in three ways.

I. The Law Cannot Save Us, but it Does <u>Reveal</u> Our Need for Salvation-(17) "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them."

Jesus alone lived and perfectly <u>obedient</u> life and gave us the ultimate sacrifice for our sins.

II. The Law has a <u>Permanent</u> Place in the Kingdom because Righteousness is Necessary for Salvation-(18-19)

A. The Law will Remain Forever-(18)

"...not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law."

B. The Standard of the Law is **Binding** Forever-(19)

"Therefore anyone who sets aside one of the least of these commands and teaches others accordingly will be called least in the kingdom..."

III. The Law Demands the Perfection of a Life that Goes to the Heart-(20)

"For I tell you that unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and the teachers of the law, you will certainly not enter the kingdom of heaven."
